Objectives/Goals:

Discussion and literature search of therapeutic problems in specific case histories; indications and contraindications of drug therapy in relation to basic pharmacologic properties; expected beneficial results, possible side effects, adverse reactions, and drug interactions.

Description of Rotation:

The rotation is a self-directed learning experience using a tutorial format. The student identifies a preceptor based on the topic to be studied then meets with the preceptor on a mutually agreeable schedule (e.g. weekly). Usually an outline of the topic is prepared by the student followed by meetings to discuss progress.

Evaluation Method:

A 10-20 page paper is prepared on the topic of interest and is submitted to the preceptor at the end of the elective.

Grade:
